

# An Oregon Adventure CARavan • September 7 - 16, 2012

The State of Oregon offers mountains, prairies and oceans white with foam. If you remember Kate Smith singing "God Bless America" you will see it all as we tour the mighty Columbia River, majestic Mount Hood, the central Oregon desert and the coast of the Pacific Ocean. Here's a day-by-day preview of what we have planned.

**Friday:** Registration will be open all afternoon but for early arrivals there will be a garage tour and modest lunch at an eclectic collection followed by an evening welcoming social hour and hosted group dinner at the hotel.

**Saturday:** We will enjoy a hosted group breakfast at the hotel and then visit a more formal collection on our way to the Columbia River Gorge past famous Multnomah Falls. Next, we'll enjoy a hosted group lunch aboard a paddle wheel steamer on the Columbia River followed by a leisurely drive to our lodging. Dinner will be on your own to enjoy the local ambience.

**Sunday:** Just a short distance from our hotel we will visit an antique aircraft and automobile museum before passing through the verdant Hood River Valley on our way to a group hosted lunch at historic Timberline Lodge on Mt. Hood. The grade is gradual, except for the last couple of miles and the scenery is spectacular. After lunch we descend into native Indian country through volcanic wastelands to Bend, Oregon where we will spend two nights while exploring Central Oregon. The Broken Top Golf & Country Club will be our venue for a hosted group dinner. Golf is available at the club Monday.

**Monday:** This day offers several choices of local tours. Choose a run up to Mt. Bachelor and the Sun River Resort for lunch on your own, a tour to the little town of Sisters and Camp Sherman on the pristine Metolius River or just a relaxing day with dinner on your own.

**Tuesday:** This promises to be a memorable day because we will tour around world-renowned Crater Lake with a hosted box luncheon and then travel on to the Running Y Ranch at Klamath Falls for the night, including a hosted barbecue dinner.

**Wednesday:** One of our longer driving days (170 miles) takes us through the scrub forests of southern Oregon to the historic town of

Jacksonville for lunch (on your own) at any of the numerous diners while walking the Main Street shops. Then we head to Grants Pass. We must arrive by 2:30 p.m. because at 3:00 p.m. we are boarding jet boats for a four-hour trip down the Rogue River with a group-hosted dinner "in the rough" and back for lodging at our hotel at the boat dock.

**Thursday:** We will pass through the northern tip of the Redwood Forest on our way to the Oregon Coast and our hotel for the night in Bandon with a hosted group dinner.

**Friday:** A short drive from our hotel brings us to the Simpson Gardens and a little side trip to an ocean overlook to listen to hundreds of sea lions playing in the sun. Then we head up the coast to Winchester Bay and pray for sun because our hosted lunch is on an open fishing dock where barbecued salmon, cod, tuna and perhaps Dungeness crab will cover your plate. Next, we move up the Coast to Newport and a hosted group dinner inside the world class Newport Aquarium.

**Saturday:** Our shortest driving day moves up the Oregon Coast through Lincoln City (great outlet mall on the right on the way through town) with our target just beyond the wine country: the Aviation and Space Museum in McMinnville for our awards banquet inside the Aviation Museum under the wings of the Howard Hughes Spruce Goose surrounded by a fabulous collection of historic aircraft. The site includes a space museum, an Imax Theater and a water park capped with a real Boeing 747. Time constraints will limit our full facility enjoyment.

**Sunday:** After continental breakfast at our hotel, we tour back toward Portland with easy access to I-5 north and south and I-205 which bypasses downtown Portland to return to our point of origin at the Portland Airport Sheraton Hotel where we will have truck and trailer parking available off site, but conveniently nearby.

**Registration & Activity Fee:** The CCCA CARavan registration form can be found in this issue of the *Bulletin*. Our Activity Fee will be \$700 per person, which includes many meals, as noted in the daily activities outlined above as well as entrance fees for all venues. Average lodging will be \$114 per night. Due to limited lodging and group-meal facilities at several of our locations, our CARavan will be limited to 60 cars.
